How we can help

NYAS Cymru (National Youth Advocacy Service) has created 'Project Unity' which offers holistic support to care experienced pregnant young women and young mothers up until the age of 25 across Wales.

Emotional, practical and life-skills offered by the project includes:

- Confidence building
- Reducing isolation
- Access to resources and grants
- Housing support and setting up home
- Budgeting skills
- Advocacy
- Support to access other services including sexual health services

Project Unity includes a range of participation opportunities such as consultation, peer support and signposting to the NYAS peer advocacy and peer mentoring programmes.

As part of Project Unity, we offer free workshops to young people (aged 11-25.) We are able to run these sessions flexibly to suit the needs of individuals. In addition, we host an annual gender equality conference which will focus on a variety of issues relating to young people.
